Wisewire Spanish: *Unas vacaciones maravillosas (A marvelous vacation)*: Portfolio

This activity has been designed to provide students with an opportunity to integrate the vocabulary, grammar, and culture concepts previously acquired: modes of transportation, the beach, weather, prepositions, contractions, and the history of Florida: San Agustin, Immigration from Latin America, cultural fusion, geography, and ecology.
